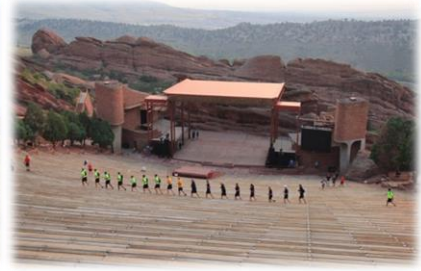




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WELCOME ABOARD!

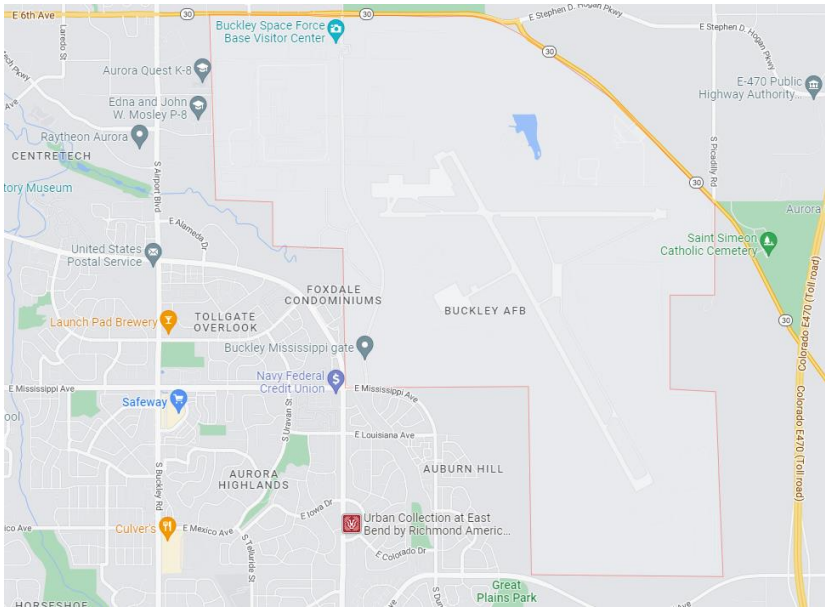
MISSION

The mission of NIOC Colorado has been established by the Commander, U.S. TENTH Fleet, as follows:

"Provide ready, trained and motivated Information Warfare Officers, Cryptologic Enlisted Personnel, and expertise to support Signals Intelligence, Electronic Warfare, Space, Information, and Cyber Operations for Aerospace Data Facility Colorado (ADF-C), National Security Agency Colorado (NSAC), and Commander Task Force (CTF) 1080 in support of Fleet, combat forces, and national intelligence operations and requirements worldwide."

LOCATION

NIOC Colorado is located at Buckley Space Force Base (BSFB) in Aurora, CO. Entrance to BSFB can be accessed via the 6th Avenue Gate or the Mississippi Gate. The Buckley Visitor Center is open weekdays from 0600-1400, inbound closed on weekends, and is located at the 6th Avenue Gate. For more information, please contact the Visitor Center staff at 720-847-9381.



The Mississippi Gate is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The 6th Avenue gate is open weekdays from 0600-1800.

If you are searching for directions via online map sites or GPS, use the address "18500 East Sixth Avenue, Aurora, CO, 80011" for the 6th Ave Gate and "S. Vail St. and E. Mississippi Ave" for the Mississippi Gate.

PRIOR TO ARRIVAL

Prior to departing your Command or School, you are required to complete the following items:

- **Polygraph.** Coordinate with your detaching command's Special Security Officer (SSO) to conduct a polygraph. This can be accomplished at most major commands.
- **Security In-Processing (SIP).** The initiation of the SIP is conducted by NAVIOCOM Colorado's SSO. Please provide your personal email to your sponsor or NAVIOCOM Colorado's SSO as soon as possible begin this process.



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- Per your orders, these requirements must be completed in order to be gained by NAVIOCOM Colorado. Failure to complete these security requirements in a timely manner could result in termination of orders.

UPON ARRIVAL

If you are arriving via air transportation, the Denver International Airport is located approximately 17 miles north of BSFB. As a general guide, a taxi from the airport to BSFB can cost between 35 and 50 dollars. Be sure to obtain a receipt to file a claim for reimbursement.

It may be possible for your sponsor to arrange to pick you up from the airport as well. Ensure you maintain active communication with him or her as you make any travel arrangements so they know your itinerary.

REPORTING

Upon arrival to BSFB, your initial stop should be the JCC for in-processing. The JCC, BLDG 26, is located immediately outside of the Aerospace Data Facility. If you have any problems finding this building, please contact the JCC staff at 720-847-6157. Please ensure you have all hand-carried records with you and report in your Navy Service Uniform or Service Dress Uniform for E-6 and below, and Khakis for E-7 and above between the hours of 0800–1200. **Do not check-in in NWU Type IIIs.** You will be turned away if you attempt to check-in wearing NWUs. If for any reason the JCC has been secured, you are directed to contact the CDO at 303-210-1787. It is critical that you communicate with your sponsor to make appropriate arrangements for checking in, especially after hours.

It is extremely important to bring all paperwork with you within two days of reporting to complete your gain process. Timely submission of your gain paperwork will prevent any unnecessary over or underpayments of your entitlements. If you wish to take permissive temporary duty (House Hunting Leave) upon arrival, appropriate paperwork must be completed and approved by appropriate personnel.

URINALYSIS: All new arrivals assigned to NIOC Colorado have 72 hours to check in with the Urinalysis Program Coordinator.

TEMPORARY QUARTERS

Families should make temporary accommodations prior to arrival. Single service members E-4 and below will be assigned quarters in the barracks and given muster information for the next working day.



For those who may require temporary lodging, on base, the Rocky Mountain Lodge offers rooms including some that are pet friendly for your stay. The hotel offers a full business center for use as well as a full-service coffee shop. Transferring personnel should contact the hotel as soon as they know their travel dates as



availability can be limited. Lodging will accept and confirm reservations for Priority 2 guests on a space-available basis according to Air Force Instruction 34-246. Prices vary depending on the type of lodging requested and are subject to availability. Additionally, if you are incoming to the command and do not have a place before arrival, you may get temporary lodging at the on Base hotel by coordinating with your sponsor, and bringing a copy of your orders to the Lodge. You will then be reimbursed at a later date after your check in process.

Relocation is a way of life in the Navy and can be stressful. Decisions must be made and the choices can have significant effects on your life. Where will I live? What will my housing costs be? What about my pet? Where will my children go to school? You need accurate, timely information to make these important decisions. Contact your Transfer Clerk at your present duty station to assist you prepare for your move.

MOVING PREPARATION

Plan My Move provides you with access to information about your entitlements and benefits, to points of contact, checklists, planning tools, and information on education and employment. Upon receipt of order to NIOC Colorado, visit the *Plan My Move* web site at <https://planmymove.militaryonesource.mil/> to assist and help you and your family with a smooth transition to the Command.

For a PCS move, there are three options to transport your household goods:

- Commercial movers hired by the military
- DITY (do-it-yourself) move, or a
- Partial DITY move (a combination of the two previous types)

The military will pay for your move based on the estimated weight of your household items, not to exceed the weight allowance determined by your pay grade. Talk to a counselor at the personal property office (the name varies according to the branch of service) to help you determine whether a commercial, DITY move, or some combination, is best for you.



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Below is a Master Relocation Checklist that may prove beneficial as you prepare your move:

- ✓ **12 weeks to go:** Upon receiving orders, contact your personal property office and schedule a session to submit paperwork. Identify your “sponsor” at your new command so you know whom to ask questions. Begin researching housing and kid’s schools in your new city. Search for child care. If you own your home and wish to sell, contact a realtor to put it on the market. If you want live on base, contact the housing office and ask to sign up for the waiting list.
- ✓ **11 weeks to go:** Compile an inventory of household possessions and valuables, including photos and serial numbers. Meet with the counselor to submit paperwork and provide an estimated weight of household goods.
- ✓ **10 weeks to go:** Receiving moving dates from the personal property office. Call movers to schedule a pre-move meeting. If you have decided on a DITY move, reserve a rental truck. Meet with a counselor to obtain an estimate of how much dislocation and travel allowance you will receive. Begin to plot a budget and a timeline for travel.
- ✓ **9 weeks to go:** Spouses, update your resume! Start your job search now. Review family records (legal, medical, insurance, birth certificates) and set them aside in a group. Get checkups if need and obtain copies of medical records. Notify homeowners’, renters’ and auto insurance of your address change and make sure you are covered in transit.
- ✓ **8 weeks to go:** Clean out your closets and garage. Hold a yard sale for unneeded items or donate them to charity for the tax deduction.
- ✓ **7 weeks to go:** Check school schedules and transfer the children’s records. Have fun planning your travel; turn it into a vacation!
- ✓ **6 weeks to go:** Take pets to the vet and obtain health certifications and medical records. Have dependent(s) give one month’s notice to their employer and get a letter of referral.
- ✓ **5 weeks to go:** This is the drop-dead date for obtaining housing in your new hometown. Notify your current landlord as required by your lease. Discuss a time to review your home and get a refund on your security deposit.
- ✓ **4 weeks to go:** Obtain a change of address kit from the post office. Send change of address cards to family, friends, magazine subscriptions, etc.
- ✓ **3 weeks to go:** Contact utility companies to cut off services. Notify them of your forwarding address to pay final bills and get refunds of any security deposits. Get a list of utilities in your new hometown from your landlord or real estate agent and contact them to set up services.
- ✓ **2 weeks to go:** Make reservations for overnight stays during your last night in town and, if appropriate, for your travel. If you plan to drive, have your vehicle serviced. If shipping your vehicle, have it picked up.
- ✓ **1 week to go:** Notify credit card companies of your address change.



HOUSING AND LODGING

Prior to any PCS move, all military families will consider what type of housing they prefer. Upon arrival with your family members, you may receive 10 days Temporary Lodging Expense (TLE).

During this time, you may visit the Housing Management Office (HMO) to assist you. The HMO is ready to support you in the transition to your new home and community by providing information and guidance regarding on-base housing as well as the local real estate market.

GOVERNMENT HOUSING UNACCOMPANIED HOUSING

Most inbound, unaccompanied service members who are E4 or below with less than three years of service are required to reside in unaccompanied housing. E4 over three years of service or E5 and above have the option of requesting on-base housing or living off-base.

Junior unaccompanied personnel will be assigned a room in the barracks at Buckley SFB. These Barracks consist of 1+1 style configuration suites—one restroom per suite, with a shared kitchen. Amenities include:

MOVING WITH PETS

Whether moving to the next state or halfway around the world, pets are an important concern. The decision to relocate your pet should be based on:

- Type of pet
- Pet's age and health
- Climate and living conditions
- Quarantine regulations
- Installation and housing requirements

TRANSPORTATION

Pets are usually transported by air or in your personal motor vehicle.



If traveling by air, consider the following:

- Air Mobility Command will transport a dog or cat. This is not an entitlement and service members will be required to pay the cost of transportation.
- Most commercial airlines do not transport pets during summer months.
- FAA approved kennels are usually required to travel.
- Airlines reserve the right to

refuse travel of any animal for any reason. Contact your airline for additional information.

If traveling by motor vehicle, consider the following:

- Take your pet on a few trips to see how they behave.
- Ask your vet about pet carriers and the possibility of a mild sedative to relax your pet during the move.
- Ensure that your pet has the basic essentials such as food and water, treats, dishes, favorite toys, a leash bedding, a scooper and plastic bags.
- Book pet-friendly lodging if you will require overnight accommodations.

Should you decide to relocate your pet, be sure to:

- Have pet checked by a veterinarian.
- Get all necessary health records and certificates.
- Ensure that all vaccinations and shots are up to date.
- Obtain health and rabies certificates, a list of all inoculations, a statement describing your pet and, that the animal is free from infectious diseases. A rabies vaccination



certificate must be issued at least 30 days prior to departure, but cannot be more than one year old. A veterinary health certificate must be issued within 10 days of your departure.

- Obtain and attach pet identification tags with pet’s name, license number, old and new veterinarians’ contact information, health condition, and necessary medication.

DOG BREED ORDINANCES

- If you are planning on living in Aurora or other surrounding communities, ensure your pet is not one of the few breeds that are banned in that particular community.

VEHICLE REGISTRATION

REGISTRATION & LICENSING REQUIREMENTS

Colorado State law requires you to have sufficient liability insurance and a valid driver's license in order to operate a vehicle. The term "vehicle" generally includes automobiles, motorcycles, van, trailers and boats regularly parked or garaged overnight. Further, your vehicle must be properly registered.

STATE LAWS

You and your passengers must always wear seatbelts while driving; you will be ticketed and issued heavy fines if seatbelts are not secured. Small children must be in the proper safety seats. Motorcycles and their operators are subject to special laws. If you own and operate a motorcycle, you must comply with those laws. Visit the [DMV](#) website for more information.

BUCKLEY SFB AND COLORADO DO NOT ALLOW THE USE OF CELL PHONES WHILE DRIVING.

Tickets will be issued and fines assessed for violating these laws. Play it safe and always use a "hands free" device if you must use a cell phone or other PDA while driving. Hands-free devices must be used while operating a motor vehicle on **ALL** military installations world-wide.

DRIVER'S LICENSE

All drivers in the state must have either a current Colorado license or a current license from their home of record.



REGISTERING VEHICLES IN COLORADO

Nonresident military personnel may either register their automobile in Colorado or operate their automobile with a current registration from their home of record. Fill out the Affidavit of Non-residence and Military Exemption from Specific Ownership Tax DR2667 form at [Forms - Vehicles | Department of Revenue - Motor Vehicle \(colorado.gov\)](#) to register your vehicle at a discounted price.
